Encourage quality dialogue

- The quality of everyday dialogue will determine the level of professionalism in an organisation
- Two critical skills in dialogue: listening and paraphrasing
- Paraphrasing? Listen first...
 - Then pause
 - Then begin with: "So, you're saying that...."

Formative assessment options

- Journalling (or drawing)
- Analysing a video of themselves working on a task
- Developing some performance rubrics for specific efforts
- Exploring some self-talk options

Student self-talk

- A specific awareness of their own thinking
- For students, begin with an explicit lesson
- Model your thinking (and encourage the modelling of other good thinkers)
- Ask: What (and how) are you thinking as you work on this lesson?
- Build up the Self-talk process with the use of Think Buddies

- Paired Interviews
- Telephone
- Expert Jigsaw

Paired Interviews??


- Q. What's the biggest Aha for you so far today?
- Q. What's the best idea you've heard?
- Q.What's (at least) one action you will take with what you've learned?

Telephone

- Break into pairs
- Give handout A to person A, and handout B to person B
- Each to read his/her own handout material
- Each to then teach the info to the partner

Expert Jigsaw

- 1. Set up 4 questions / activities
- 2. Start (and finish) in the Home teams



- 3. Organise everyone into Home teams (with 4 in each team)
- 4. Each team member chooses a specific question
- 5. Each person then moves into an Expert Team (eg all No 1s, No 2s, and so on)
- 6. The new 'Expert' teams discuss their question
- 7. Everyone returns to their Home team, and explain their Expert team's discussion to their Home team members

Discuss: Publish: Shop: Polish

Form into teams of 4, and then:

- 1. <u>Discuss</u> all of your different responses to the question being addressed
- 2. <u>Publish</u> a collection of these; each team to place their 1st draft on a large sheet
- 3. Shop for ideas from the other groups in the room
- 4. Polish off your plan back in your own team
